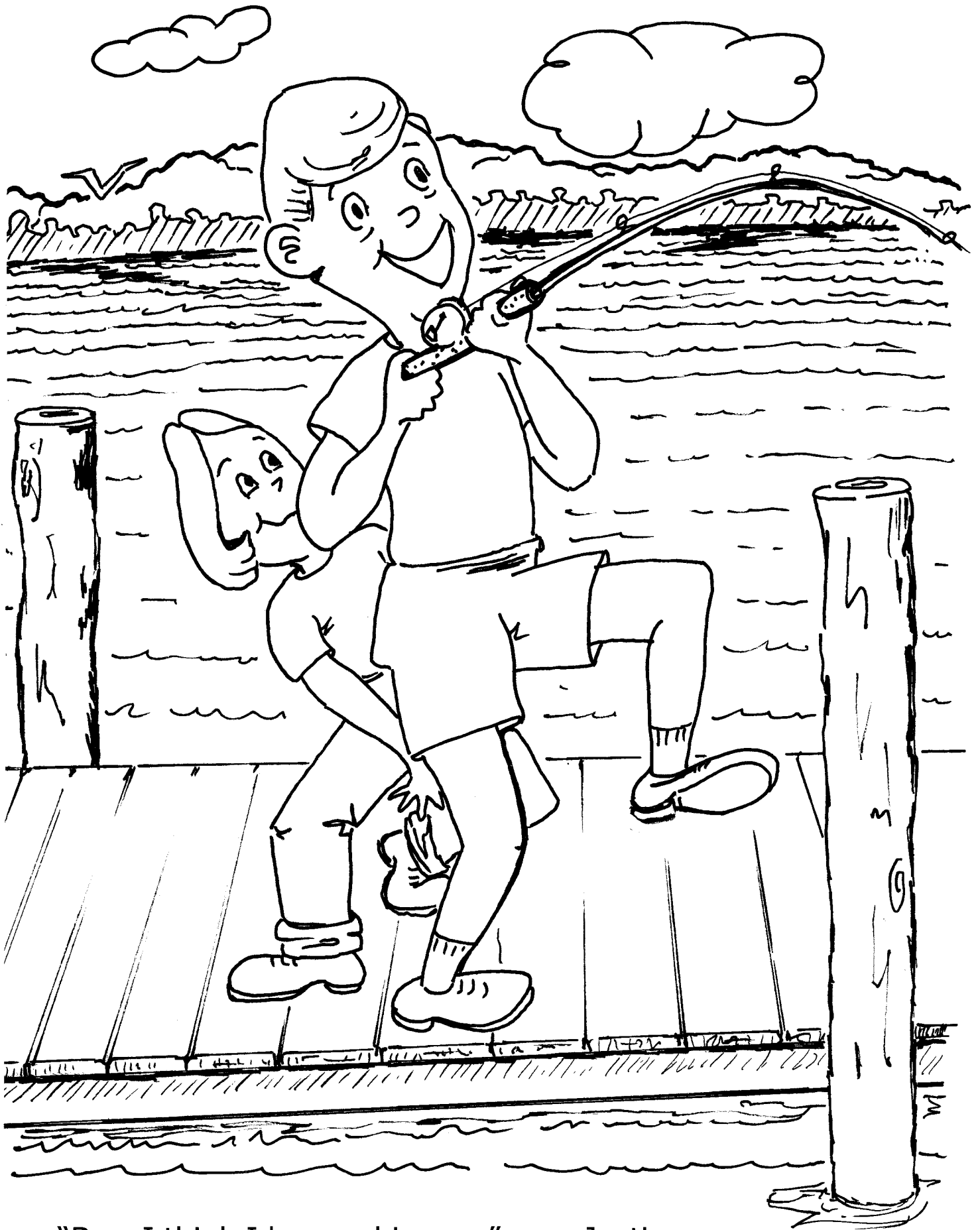


Justin and Jenna set off together for a day of fishing.

"I am going to catch a BIG fish!" answers Justin.

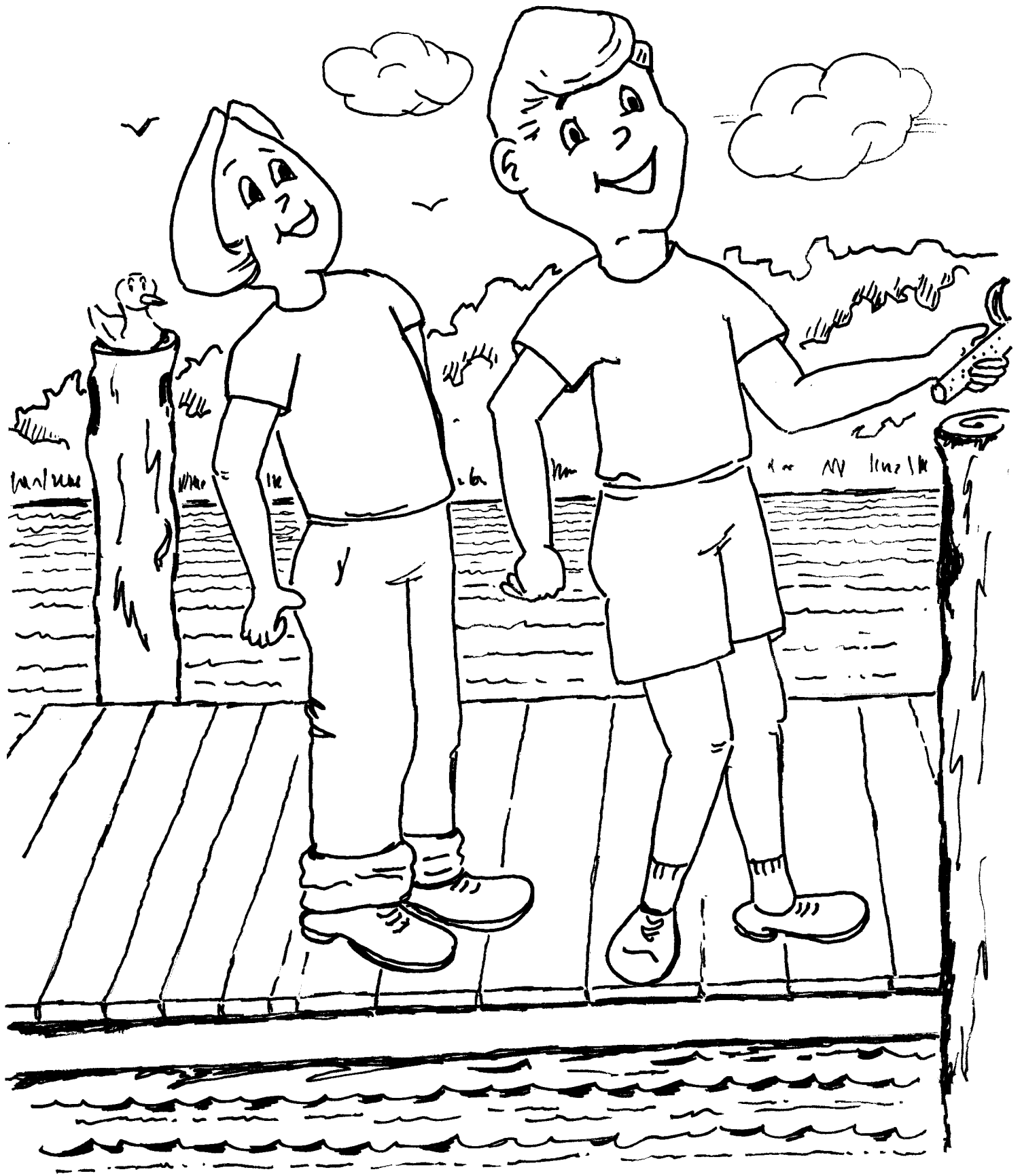


"Boy, I think I have a big one," says Justin.

"because I'm a TALKING MUSKY and Milt is my name."



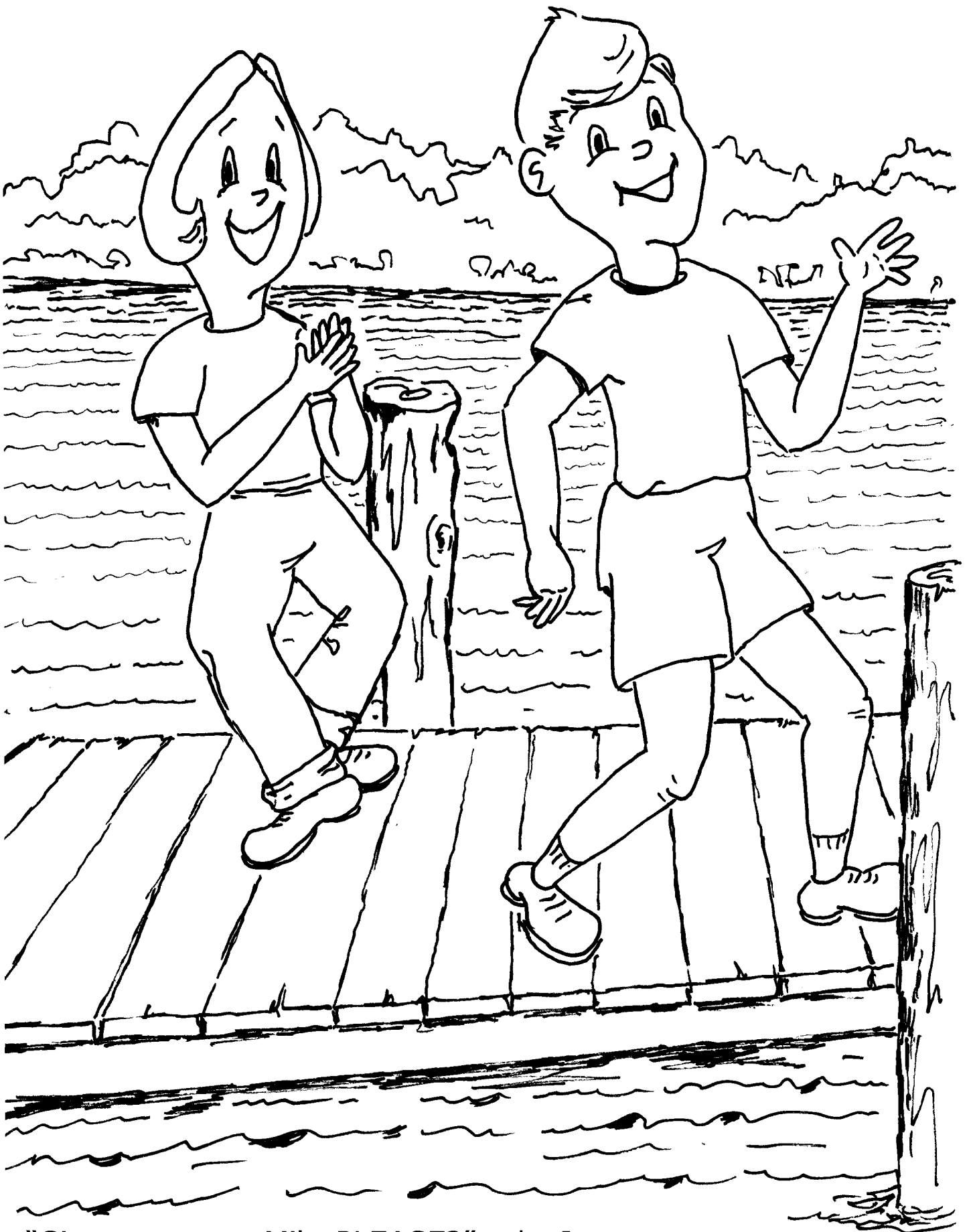
"A talking musky," says Jenna, "who will believe it?"

"I know I do, and I will let you go," says Justin.



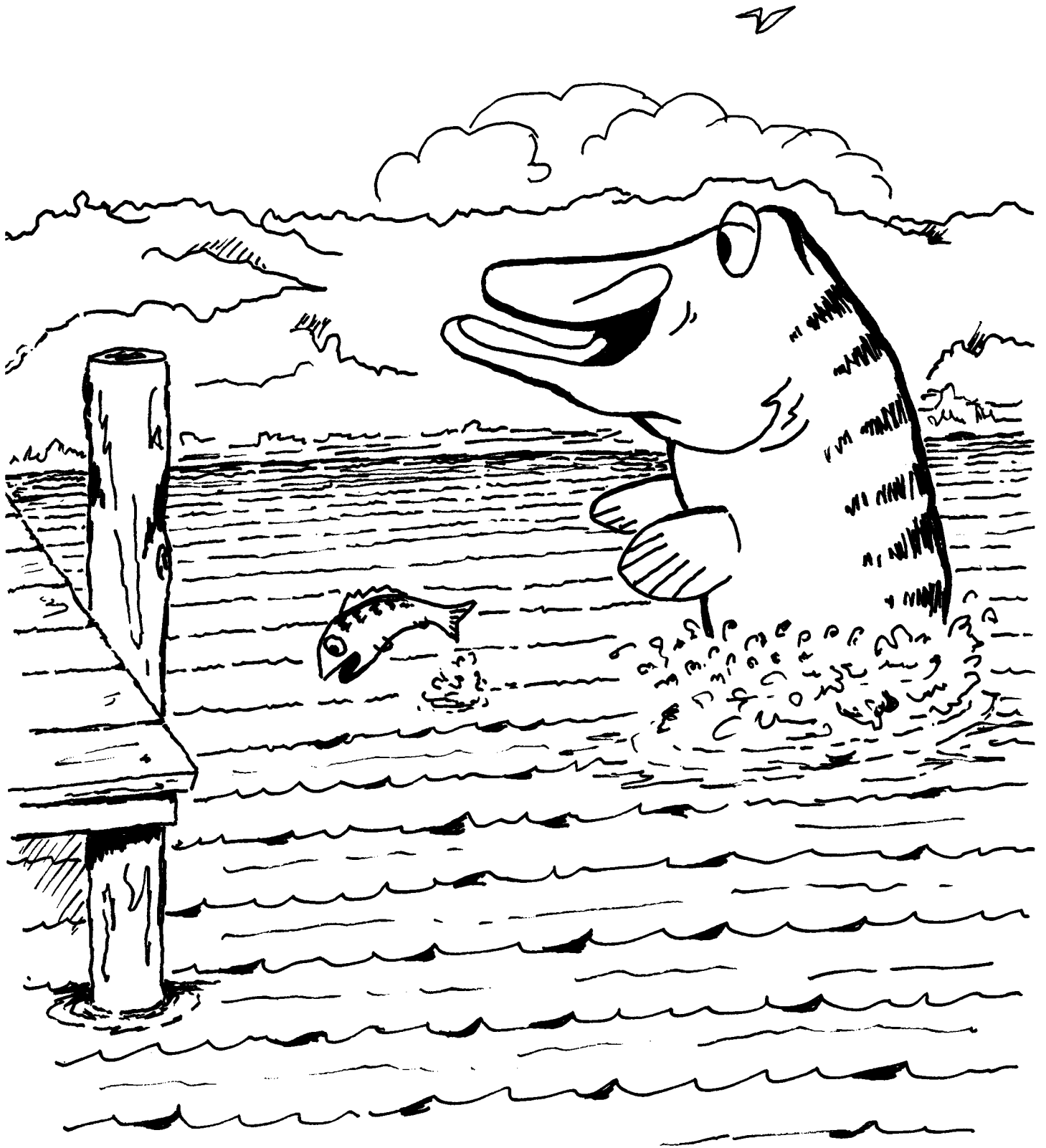
"How did you learn to talk?" asks Jenna.

These small rules you all should know by the time that you are turning eight.

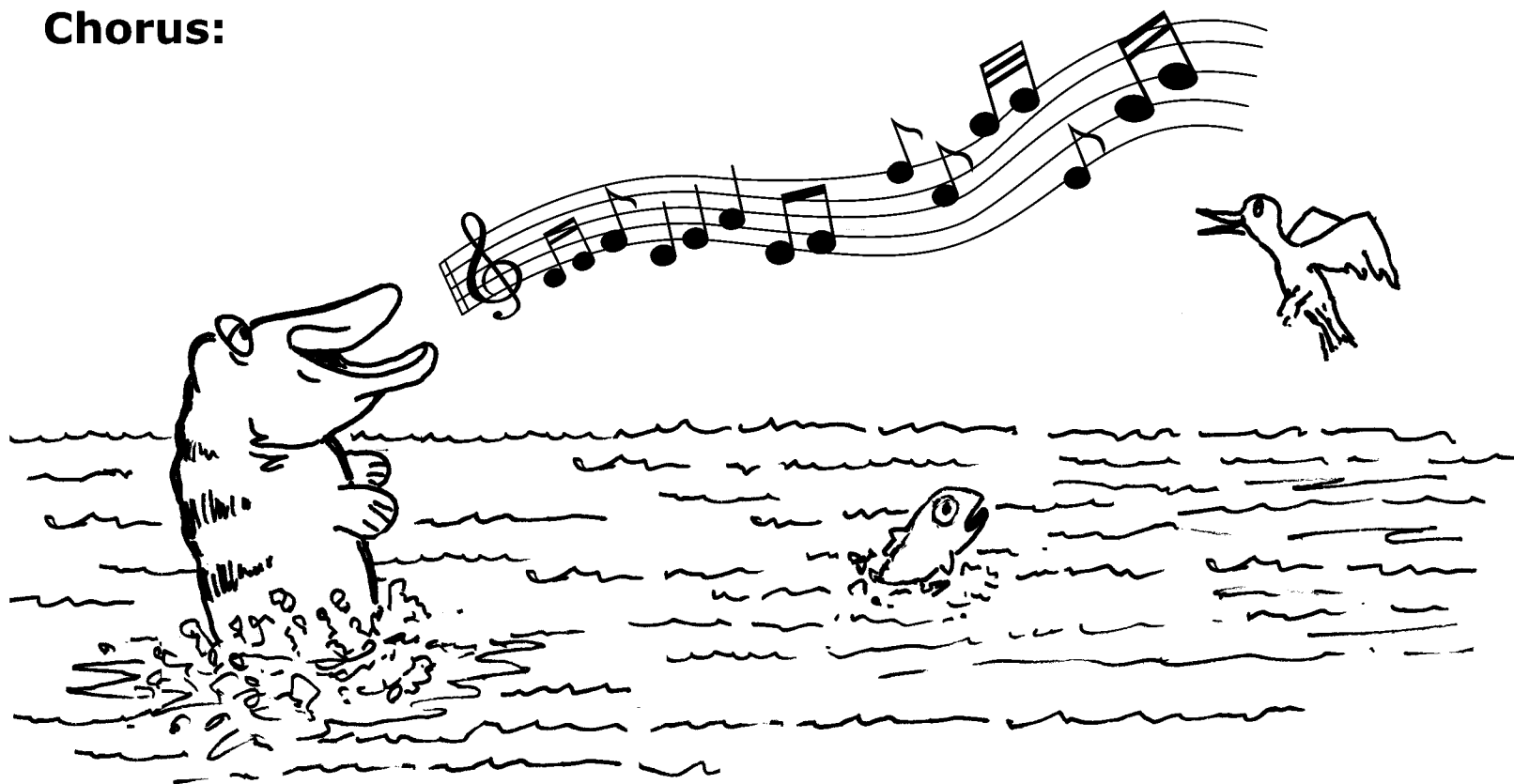

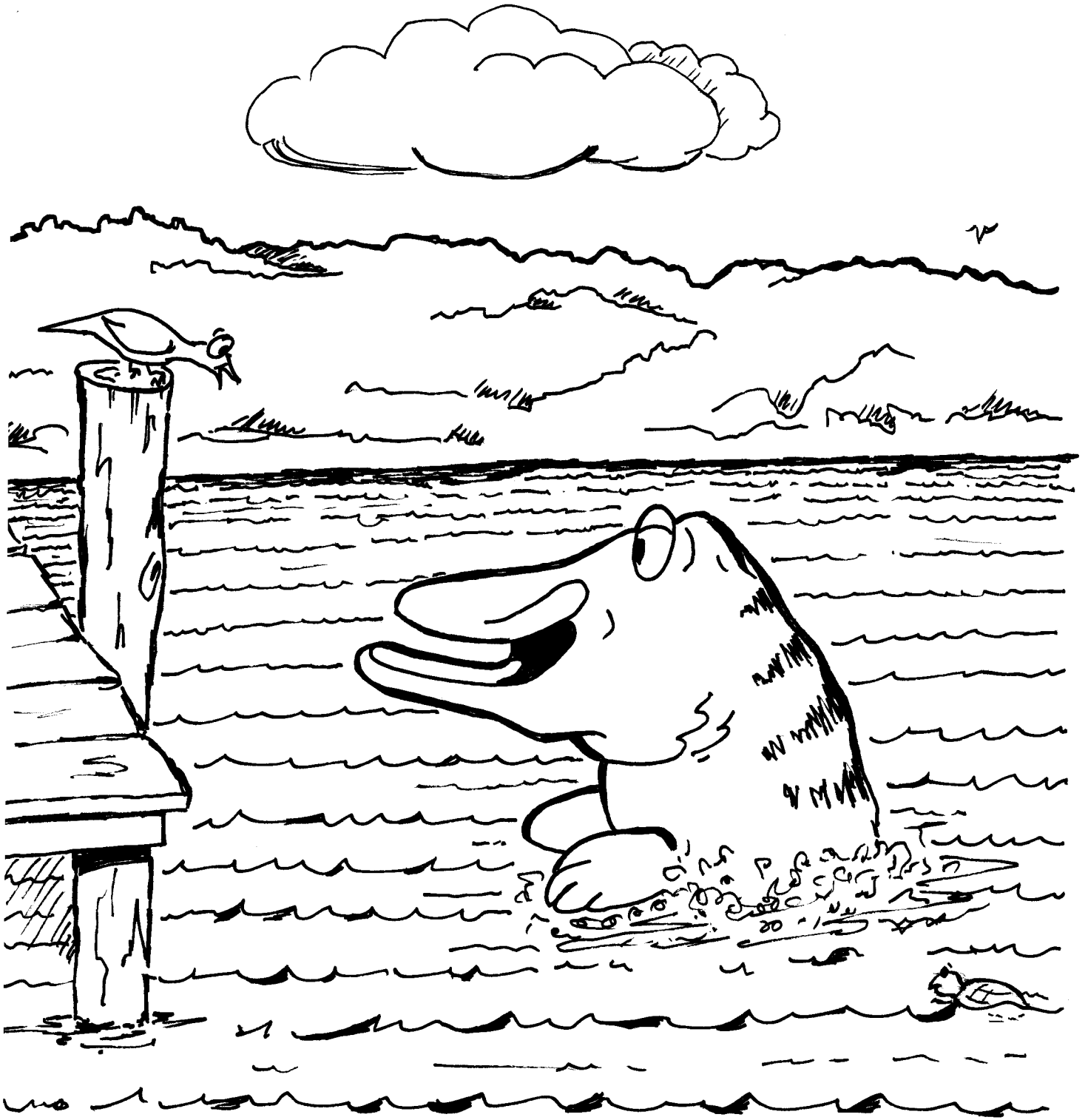
I'm Milt the talking Musky, stranger to the land. If you want to sing along to

Follow along and see just what I mean.

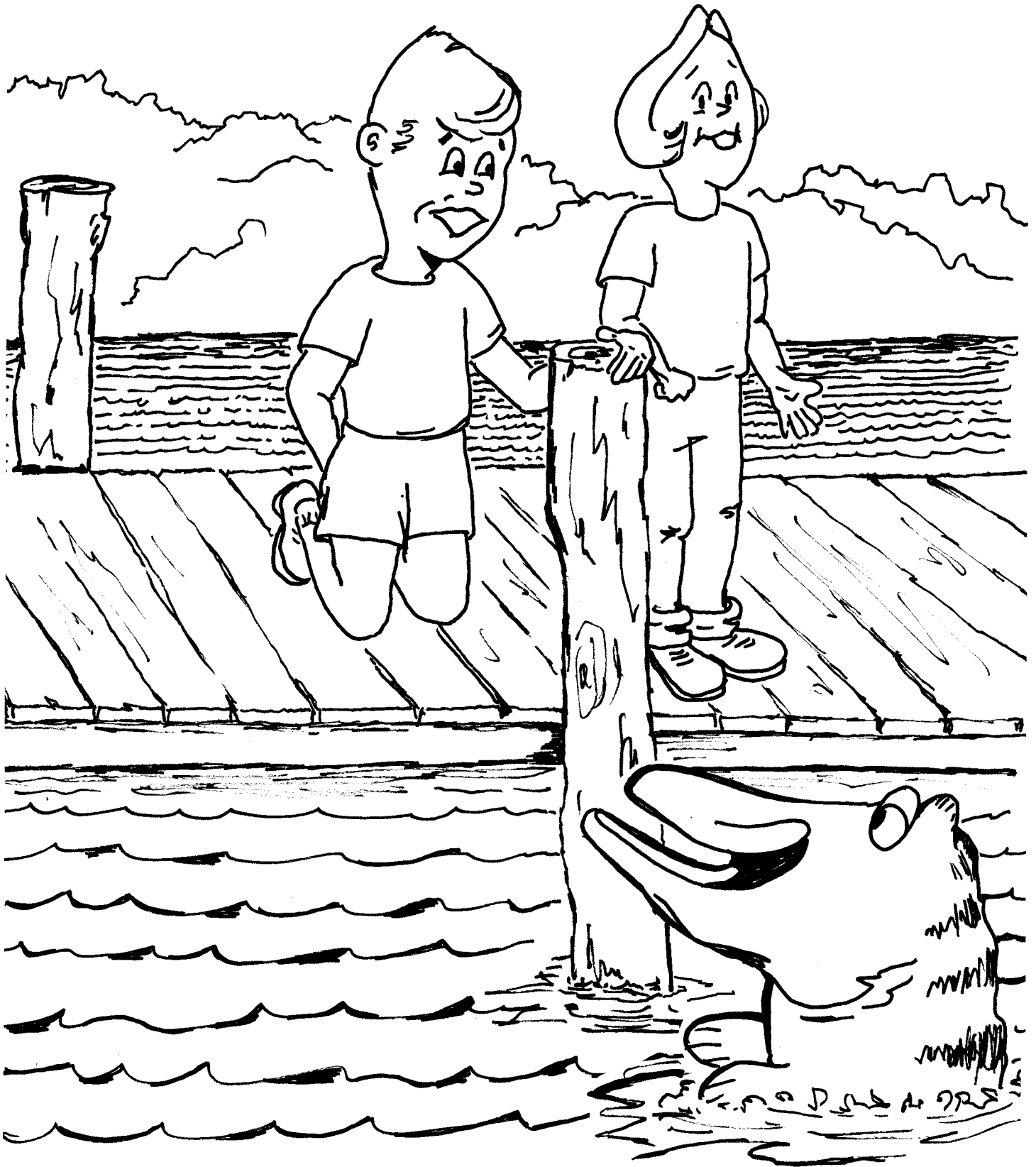
Do your homework after school. Read a book with Mom or Dad.

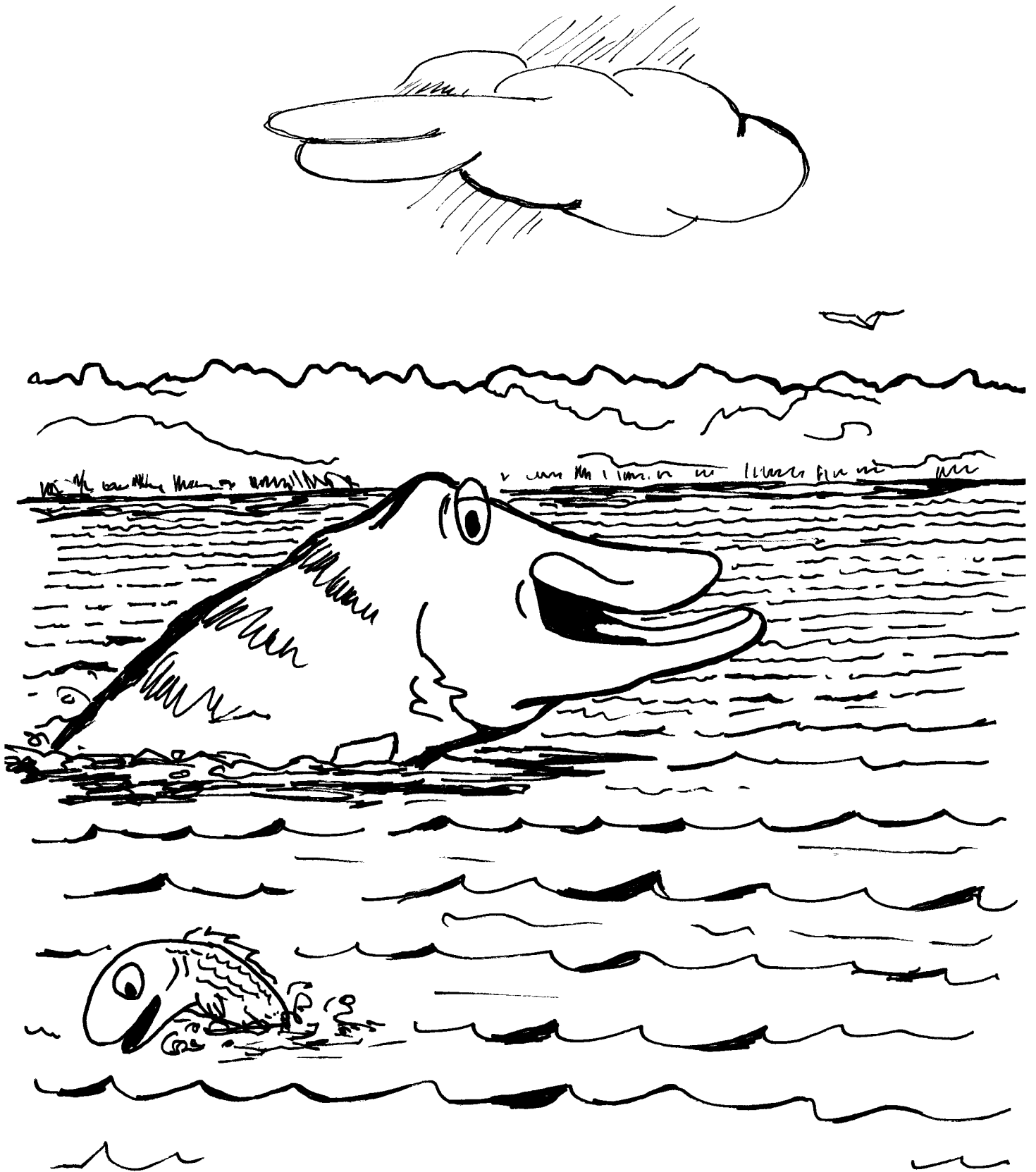

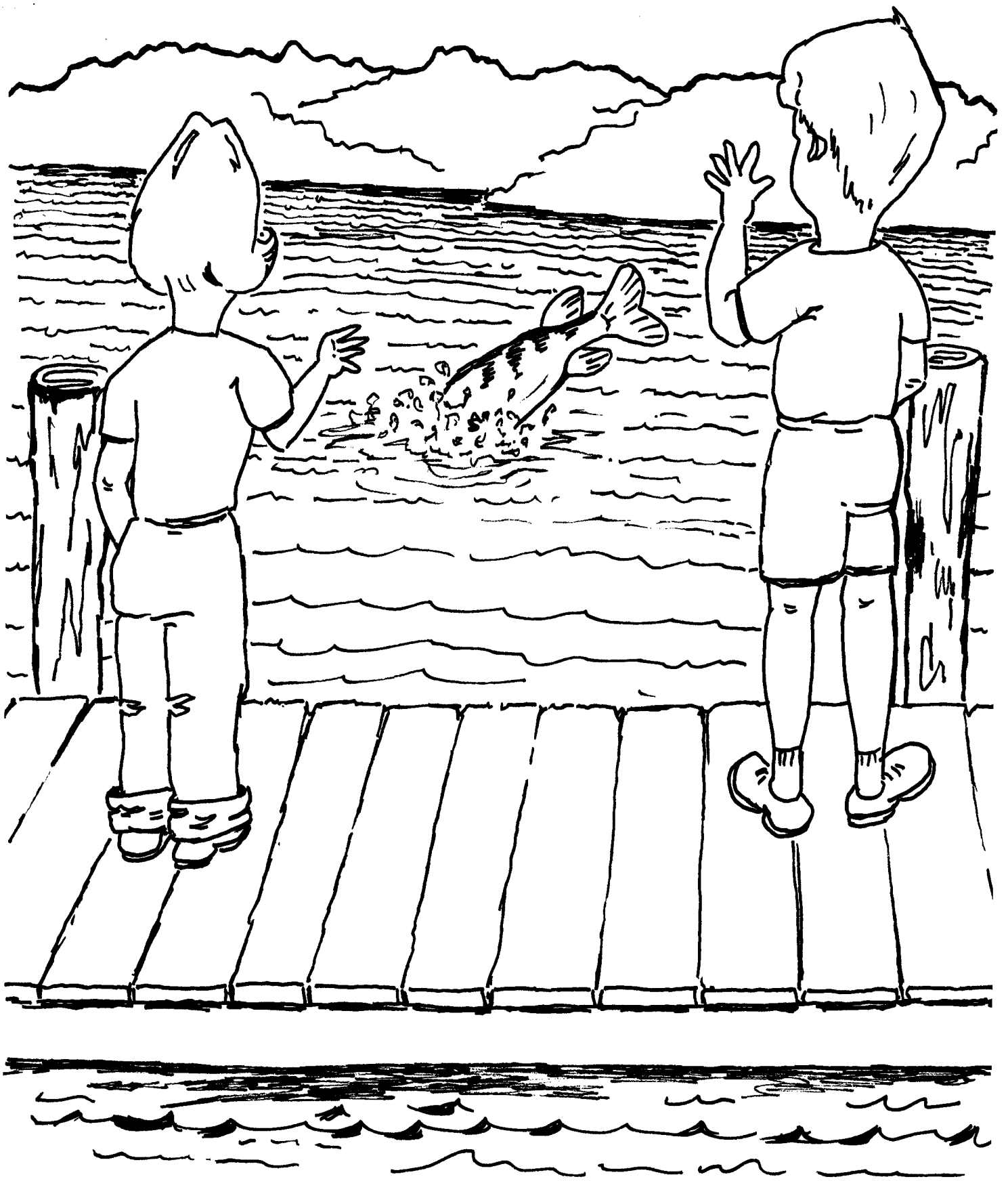

"Just look for me early tomorrow, and I may tell you some stories," answers Milt.

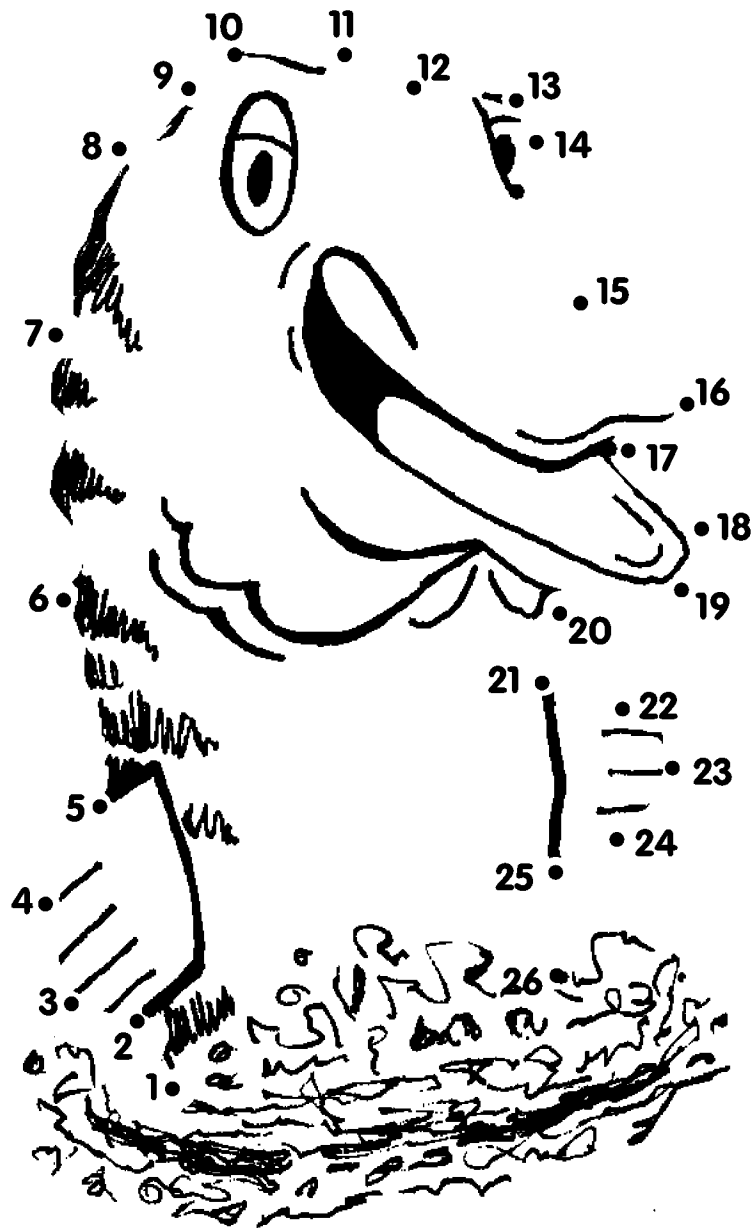

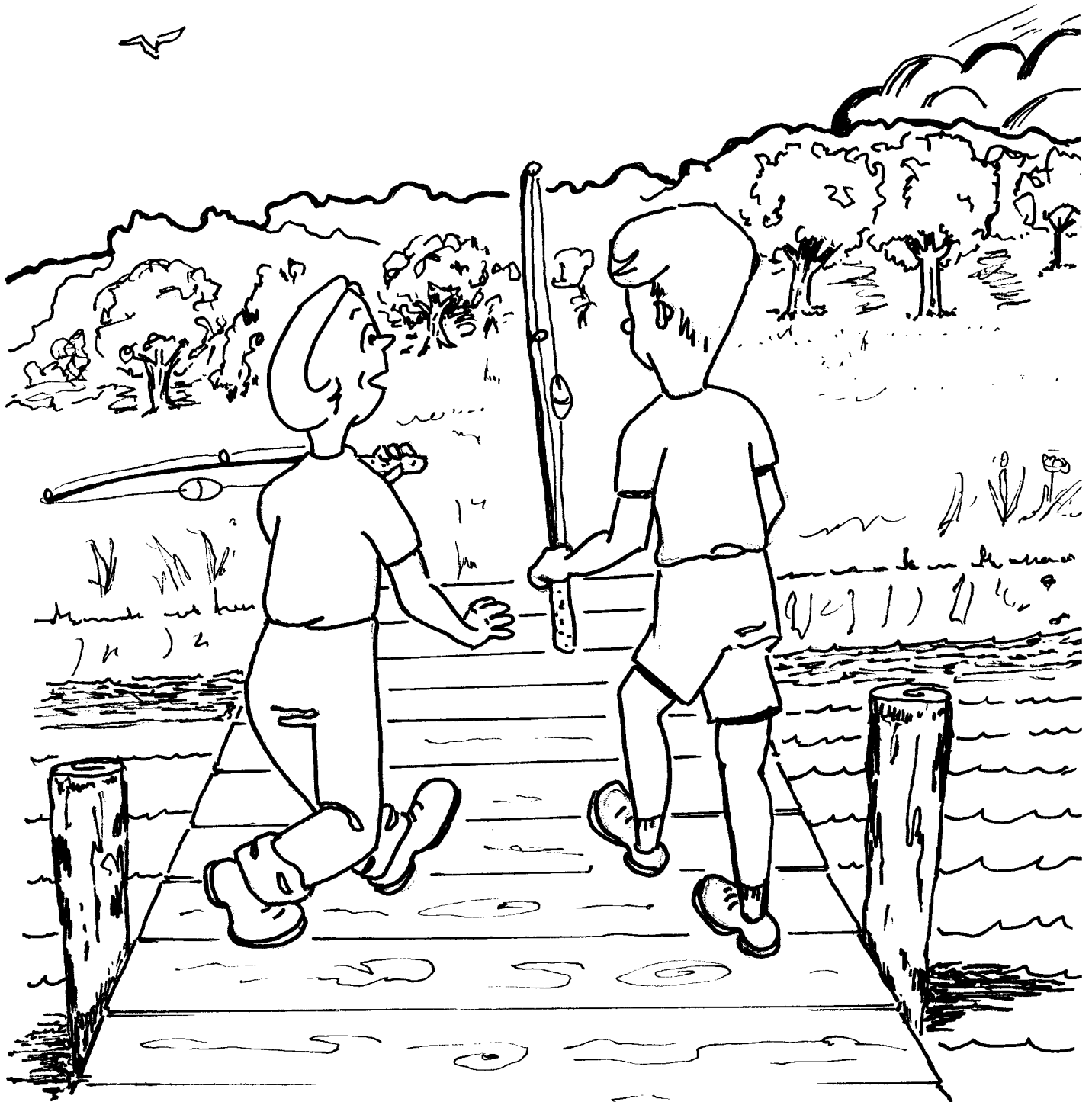

We better run fast before we get wet!” says Justin.

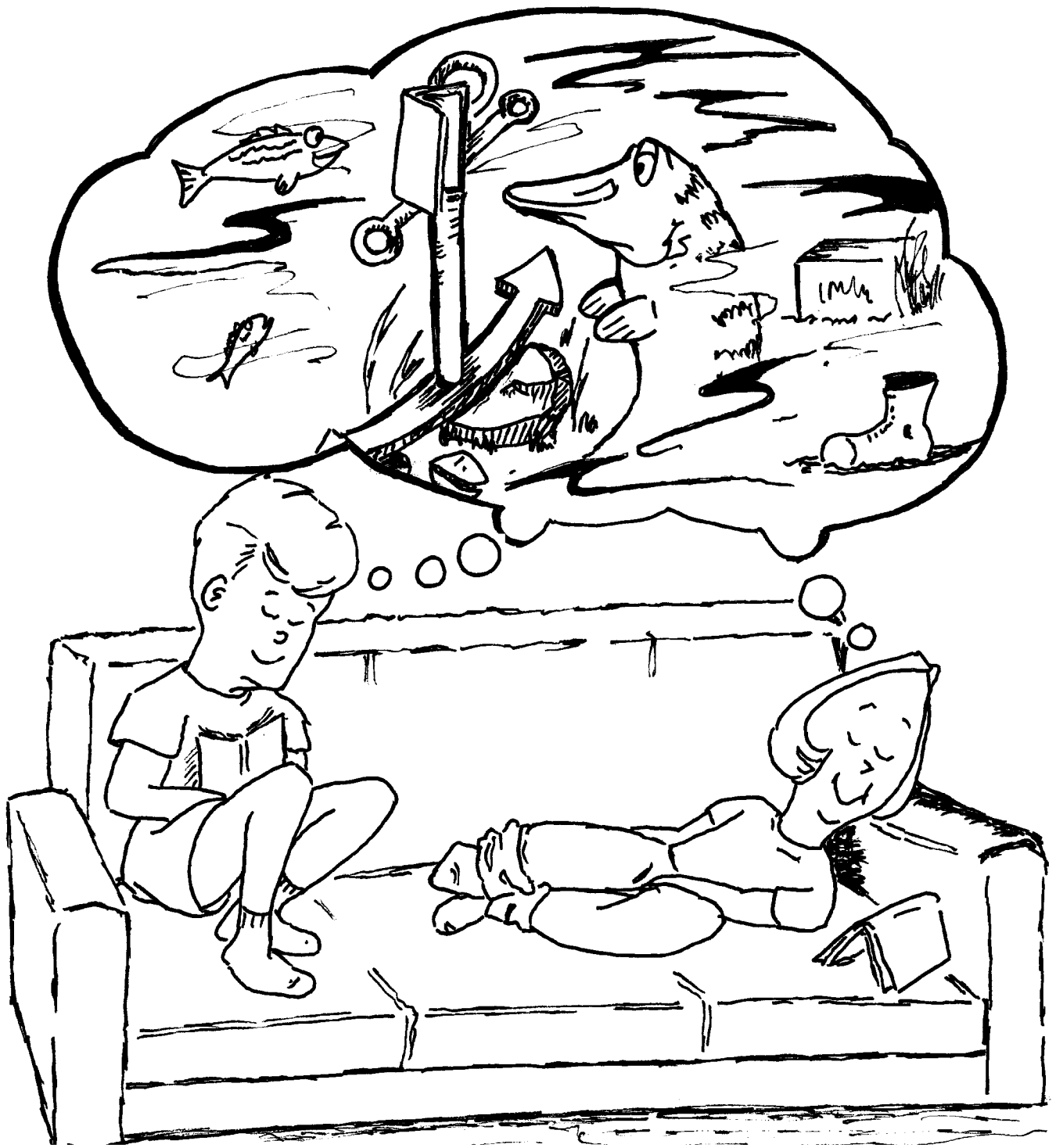


"What is going on here? Are they both reading?" Father asks.

I thought it was strange. I heard them singing, too.

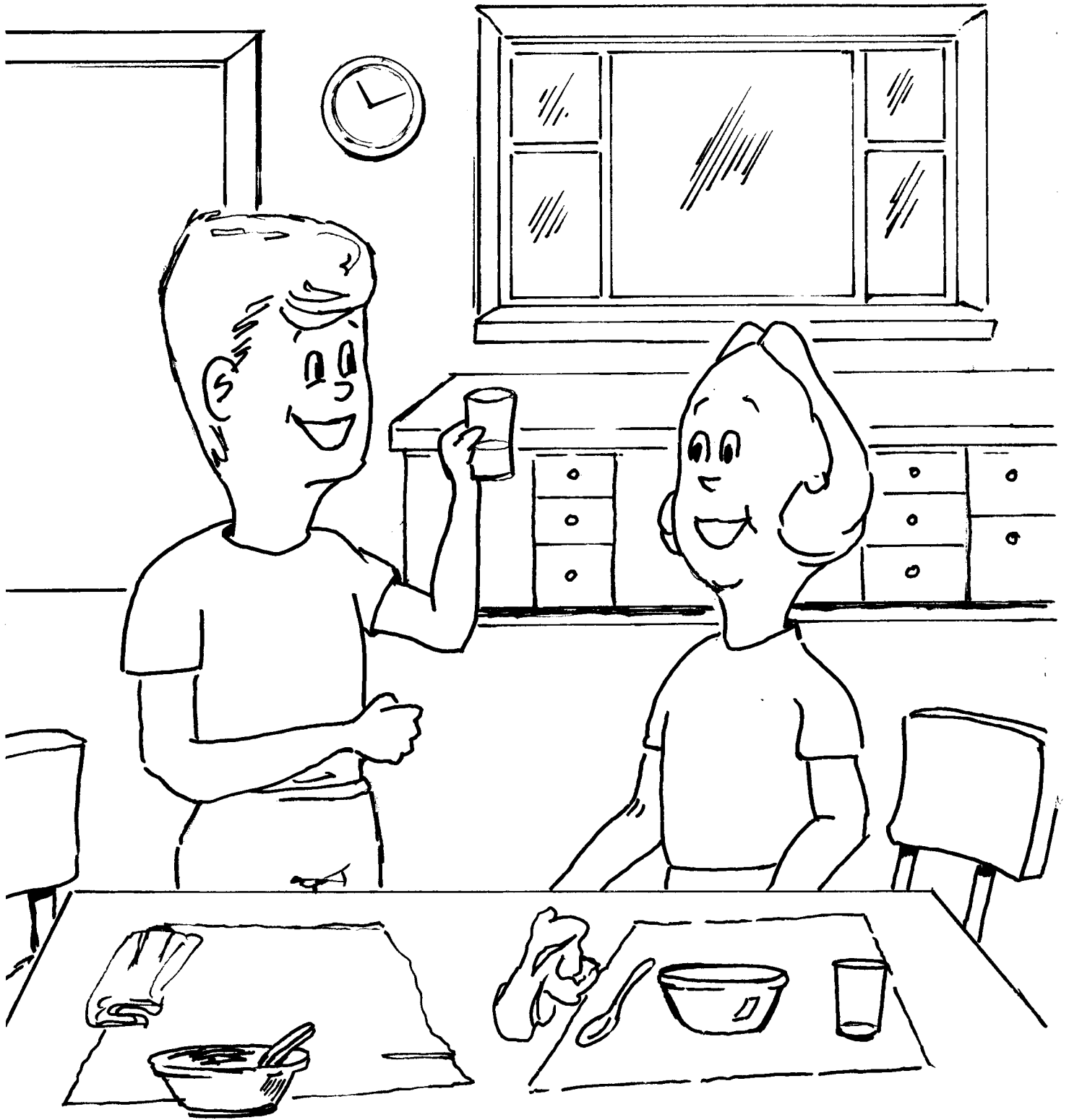
We really should spend more time reading with them," says Mother.

"They look like they are having a dream. I sure wish I could see what they see right now. Shall we wake them up or try to carry them to their beds?" asks Father.

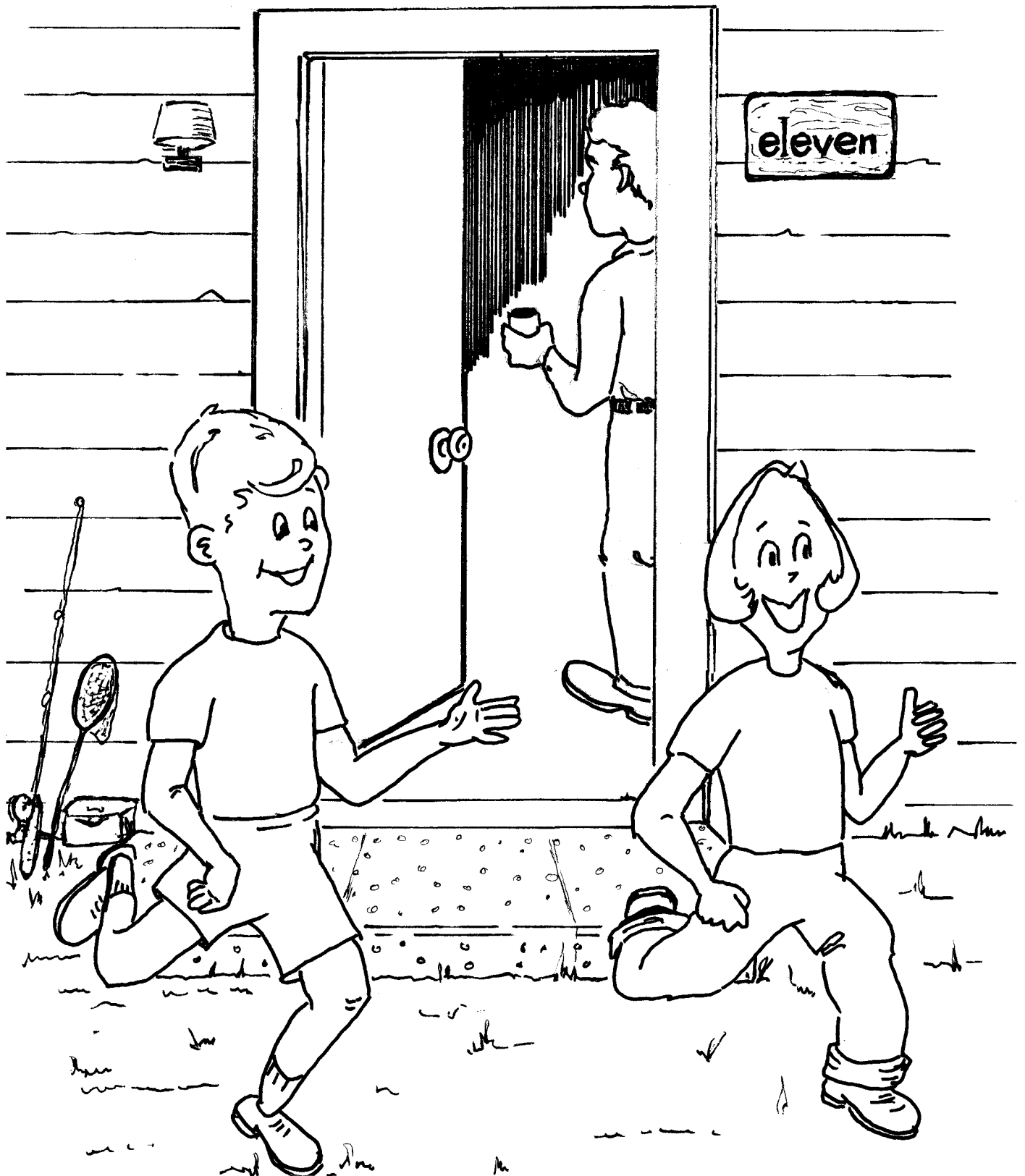
"Just pick them up and put them in bed. It won't hurt them to be in bed early," says Mother.

"Did you have enough to eat, and did you drink your juice?" asks Mother.

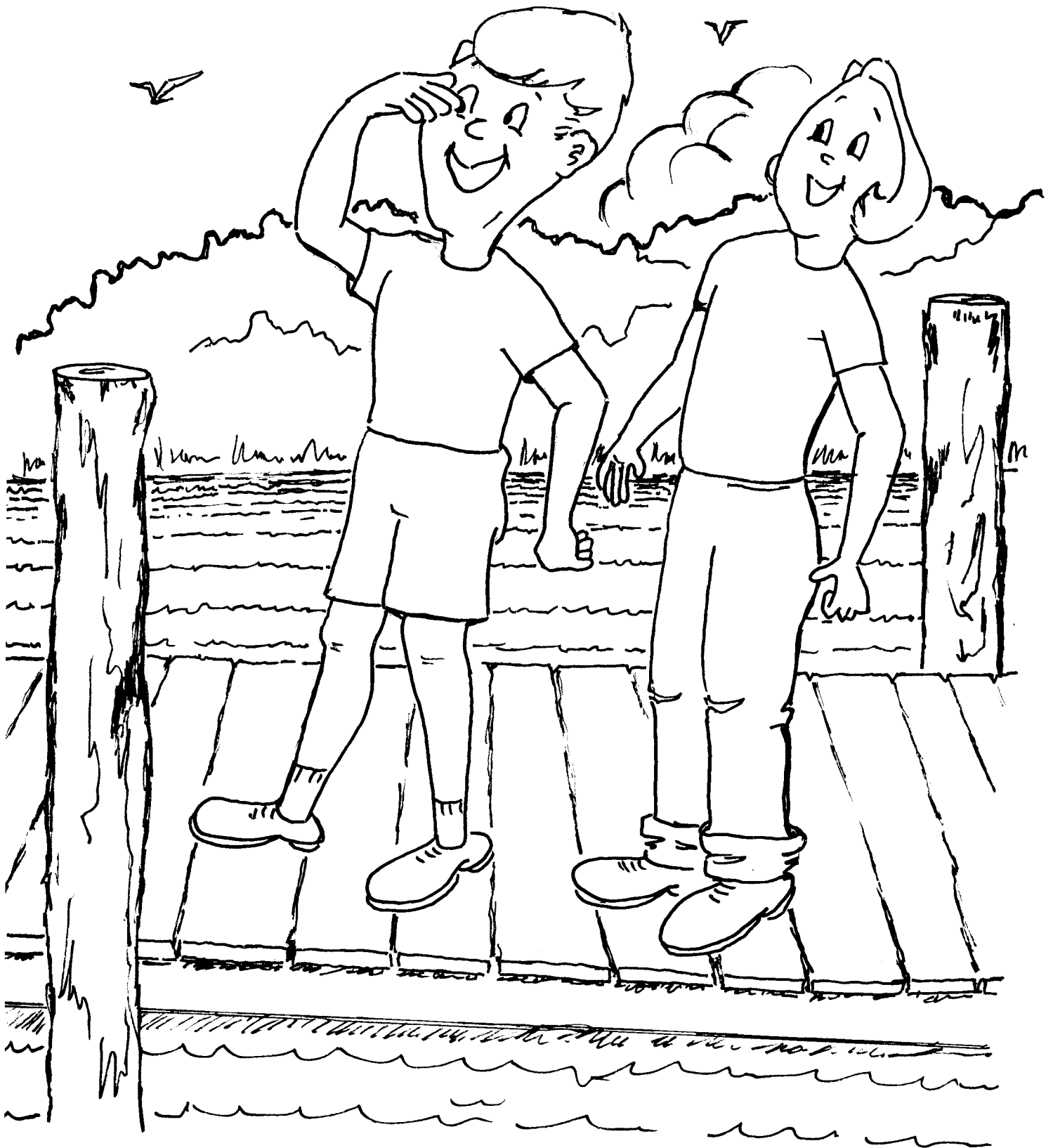
"Yes, we are full," the children say.



"We have to find Milt again," says Justin.

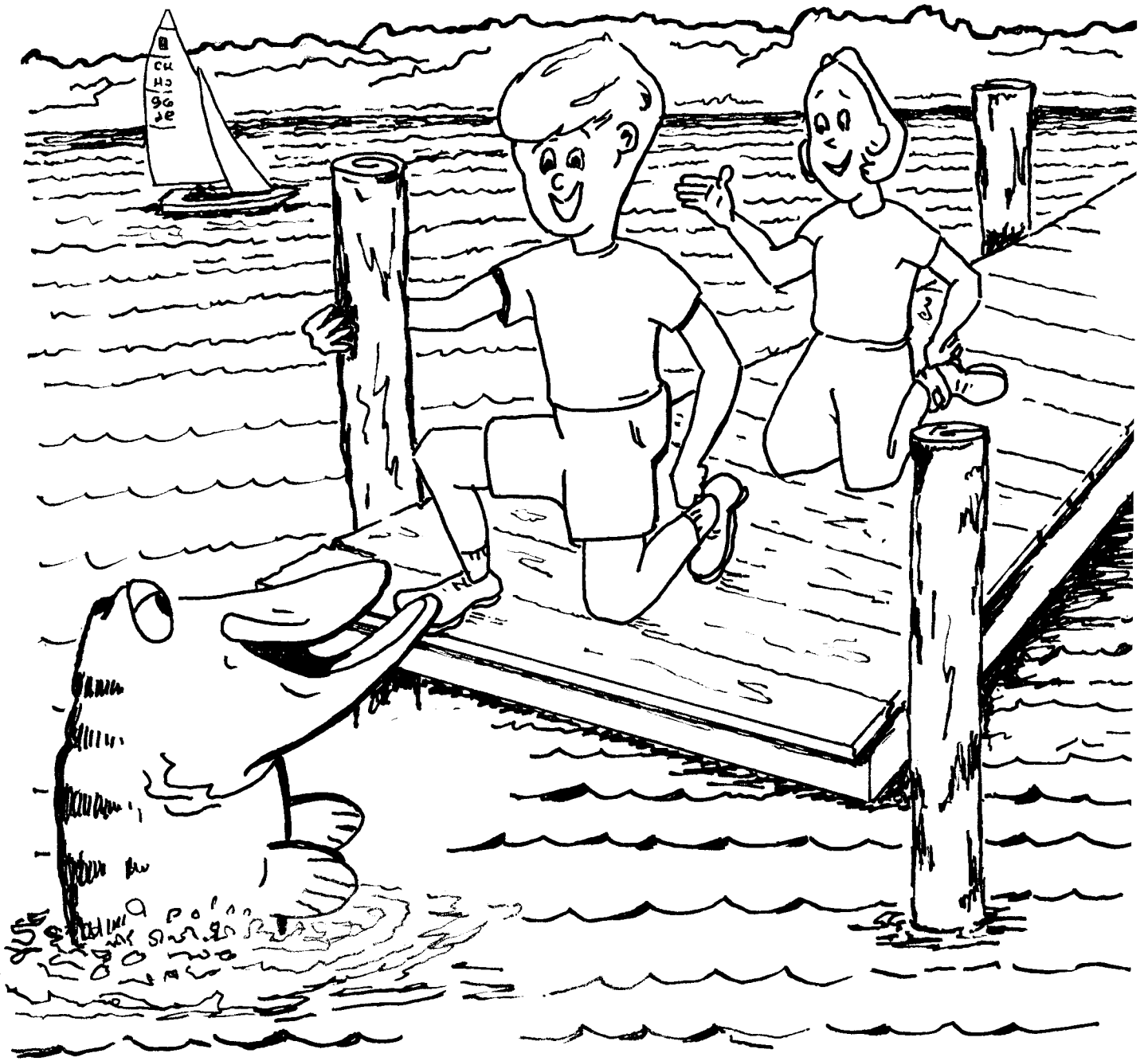
"Milt, who is Milt?" asks Father.

"What country are you from, Milt?" asks Jenna.

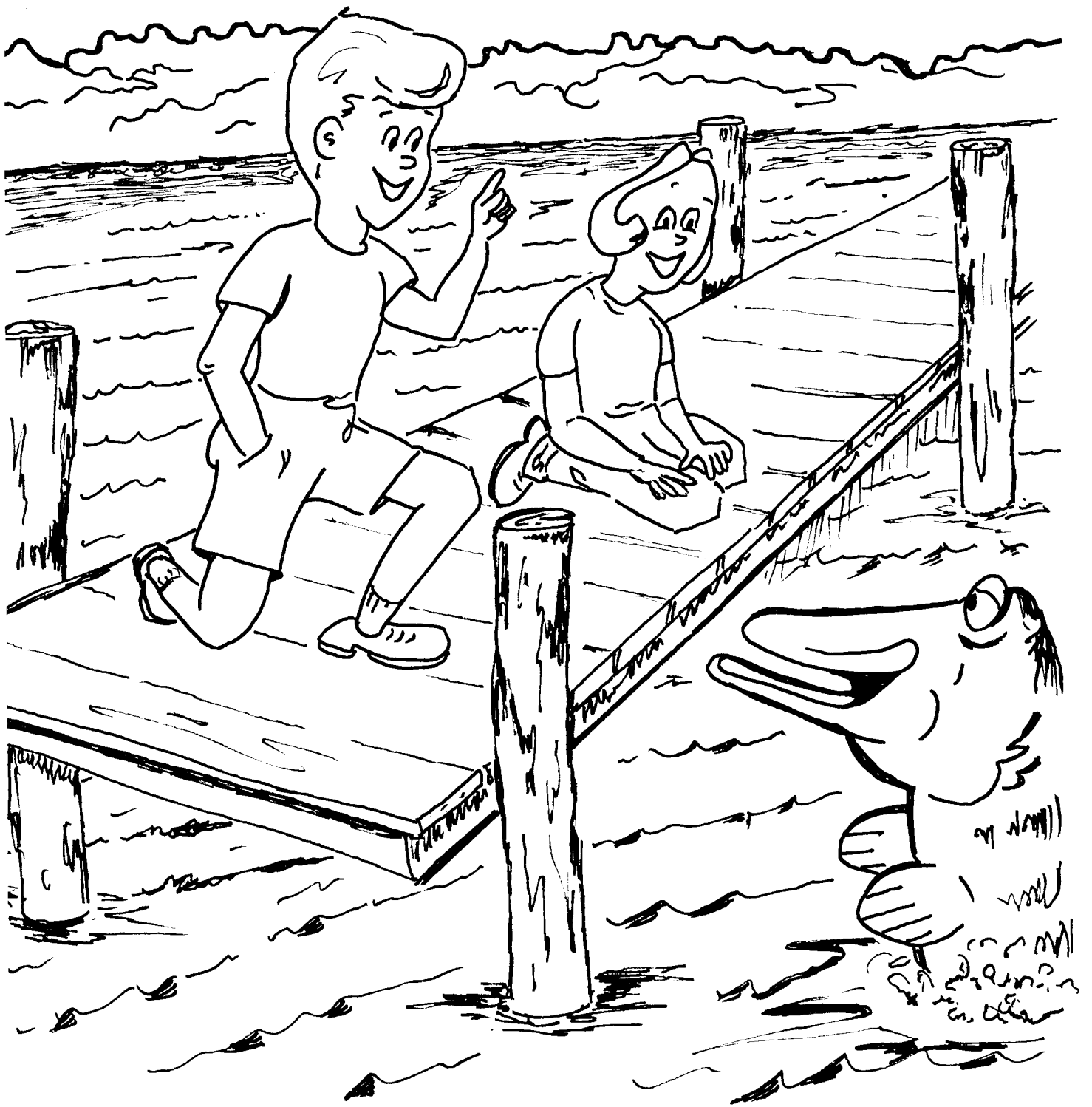
"I am from America, just like you," says Milt.

"I cannot ride a bike or walk," says Milt.



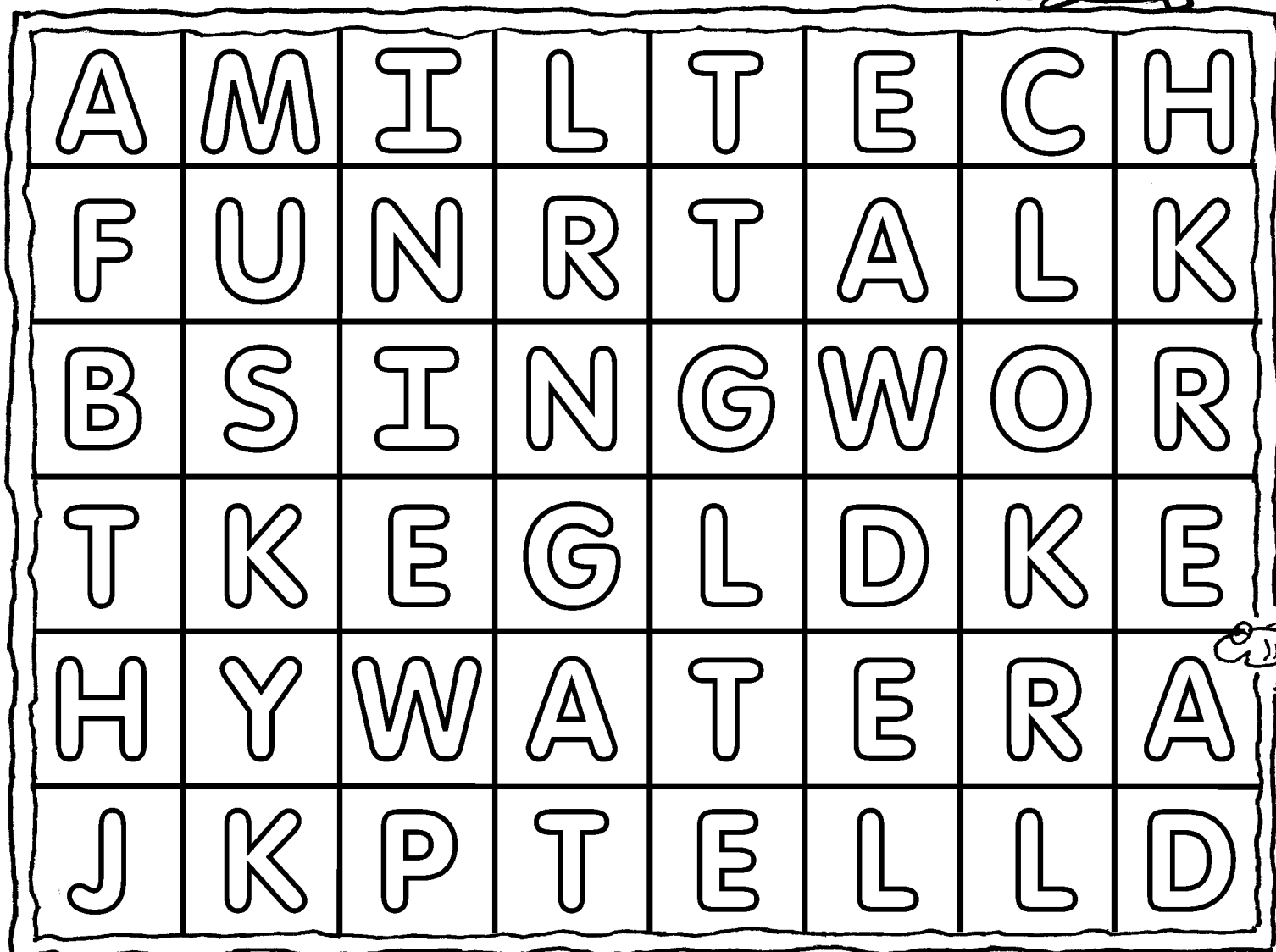
"Have you ever been around the world?" asks Justin.

I **READ** a lot.

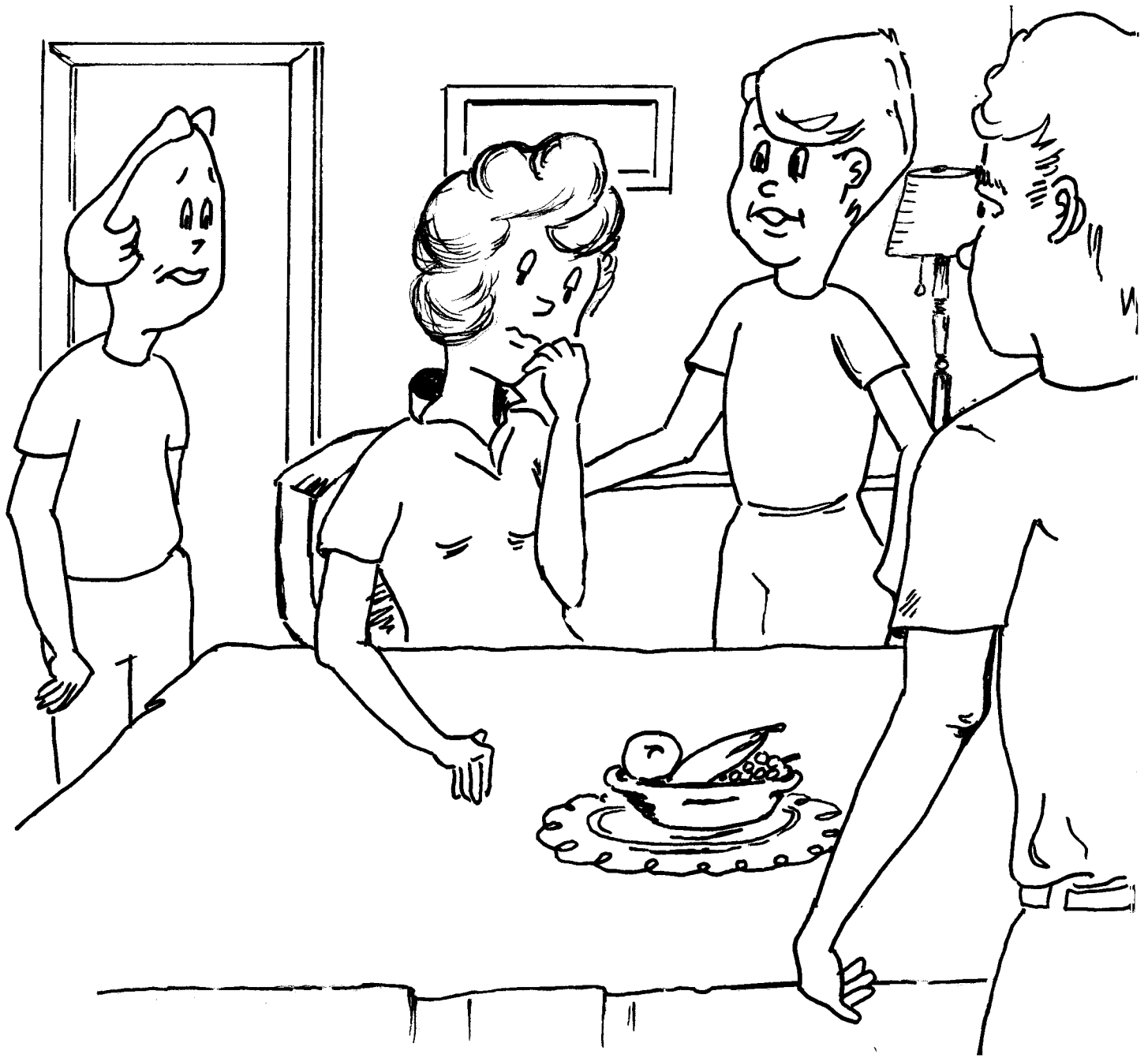

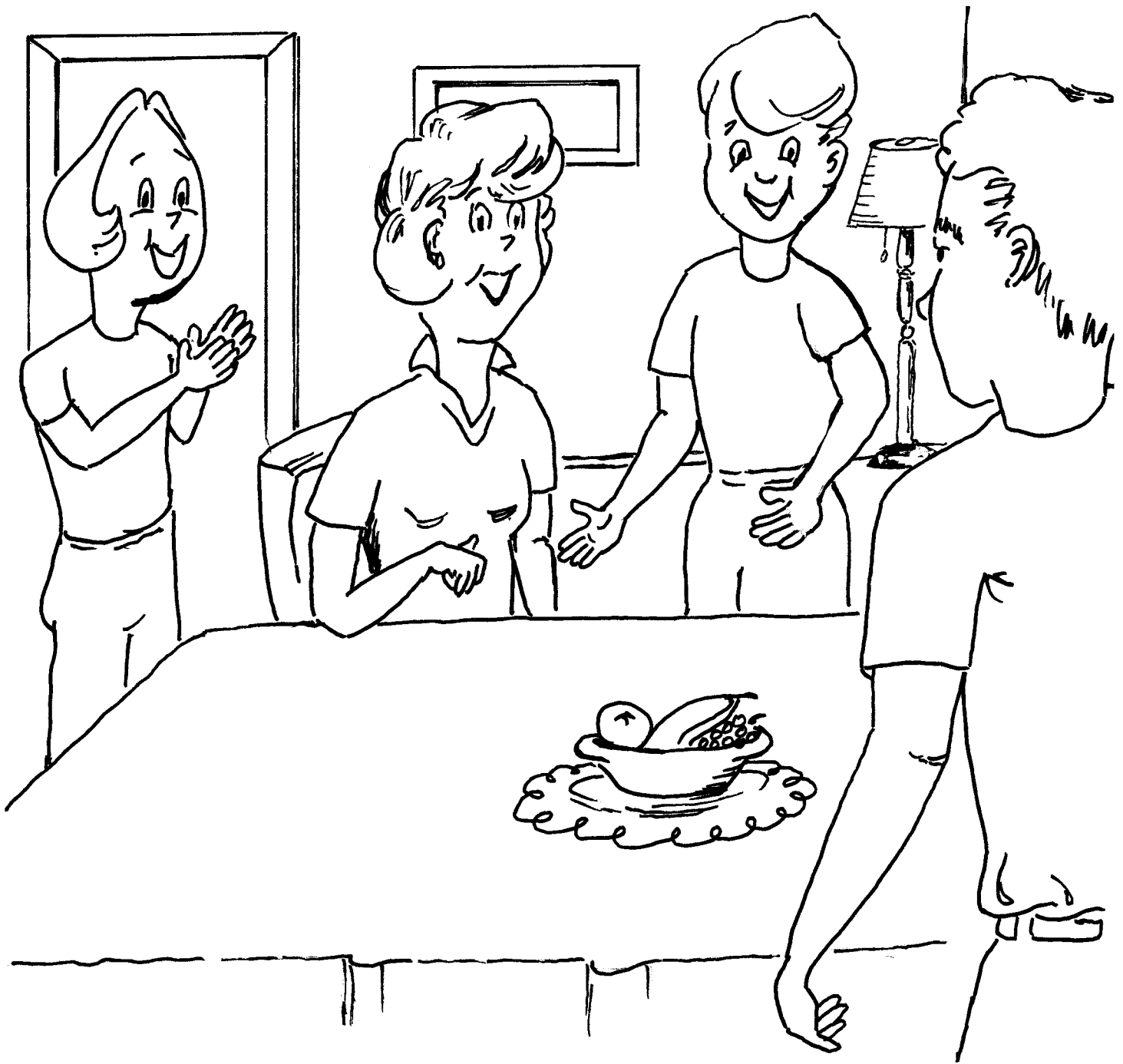
"Why are you sad, Mother?" asks Justin.

"It was very special."



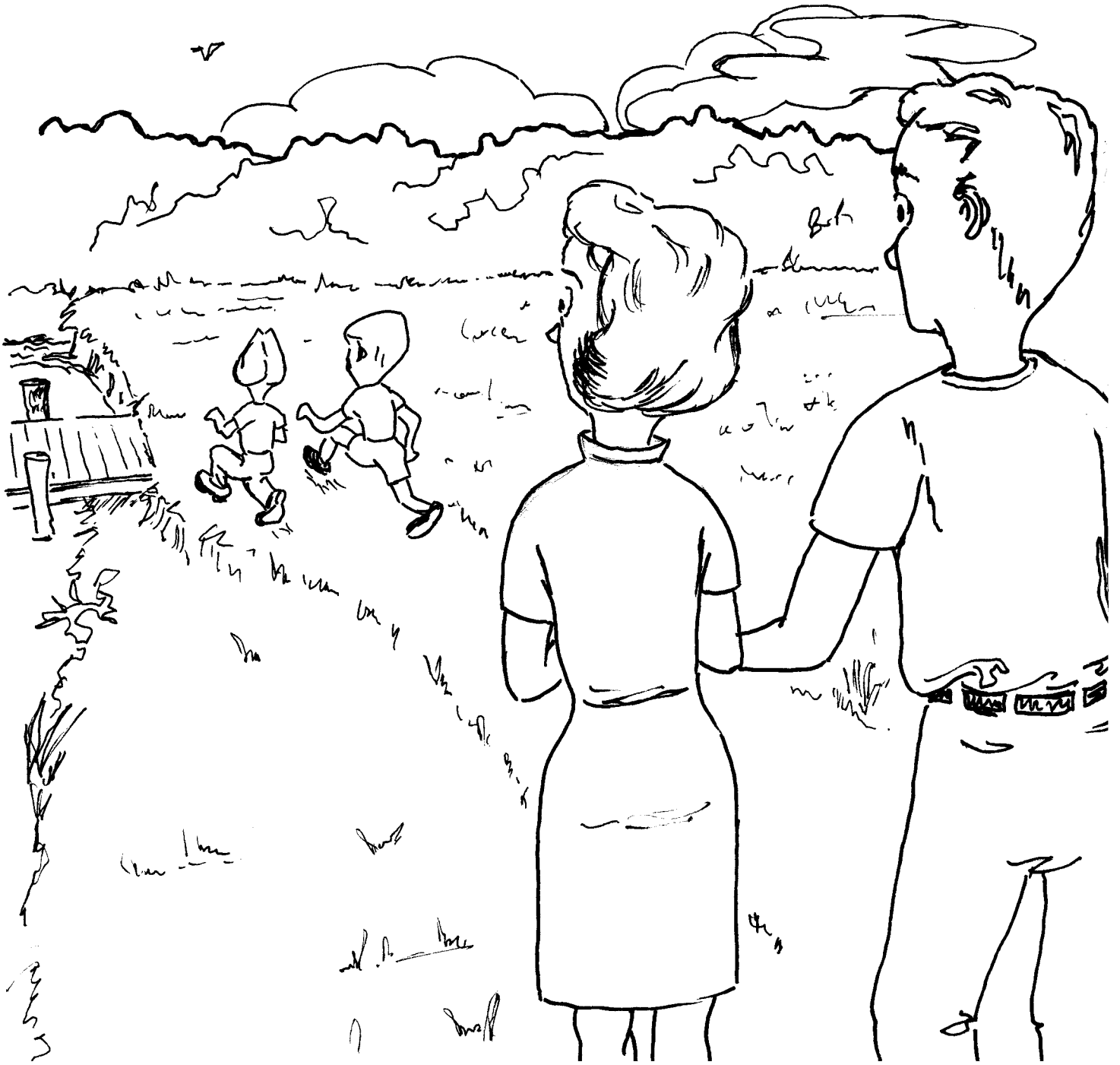
"Milt can find it for you!" says Jenna.

"So, Milt is a talking musky?" says Father.

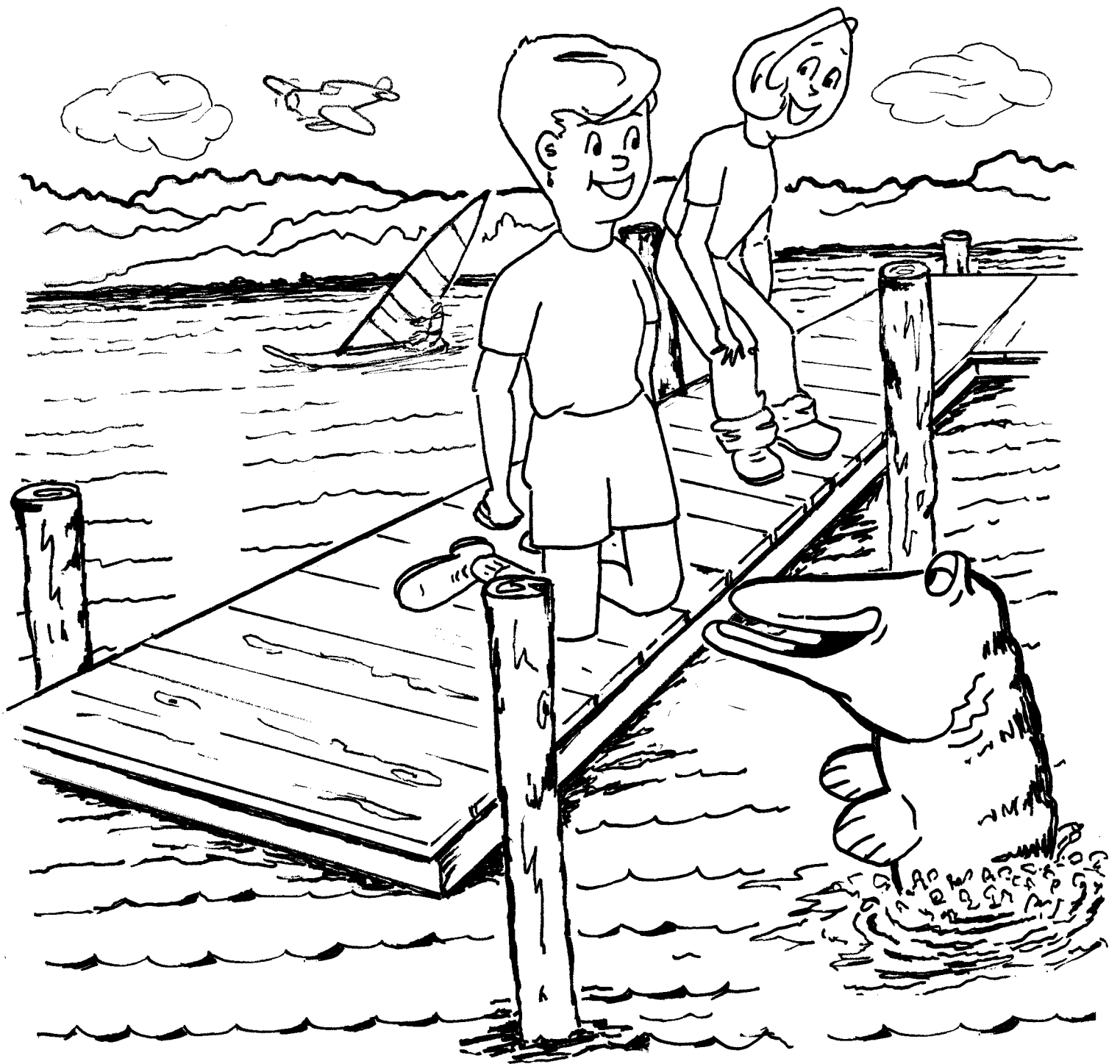
"Should we make them stop believing in him?" asks Mother.

They will grow out of it," says Father.

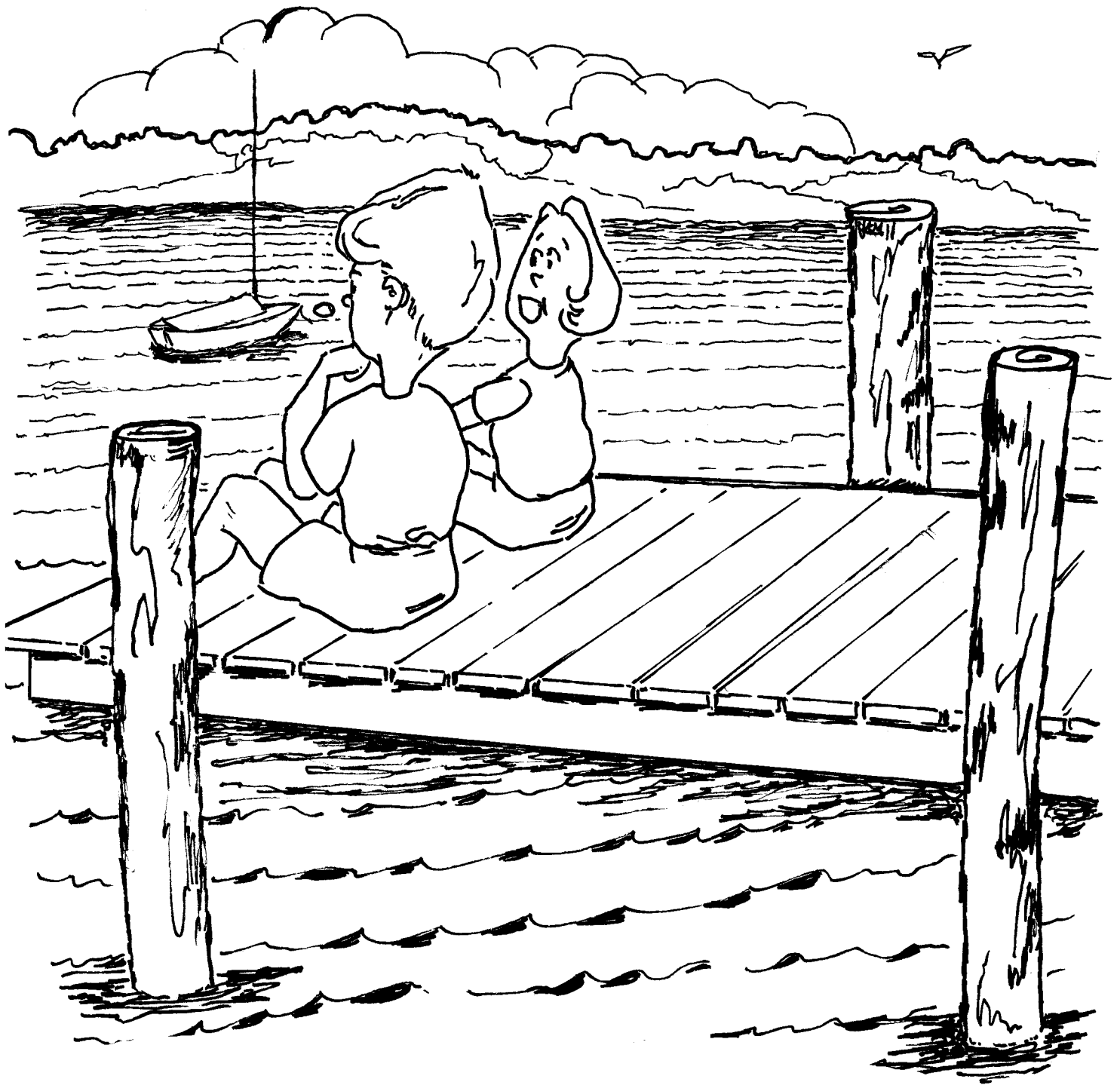


"Milt, could you find Mother's bracelet?" asks Justin. "She lost it in the water."

"Could you please look?" asks Jenna.

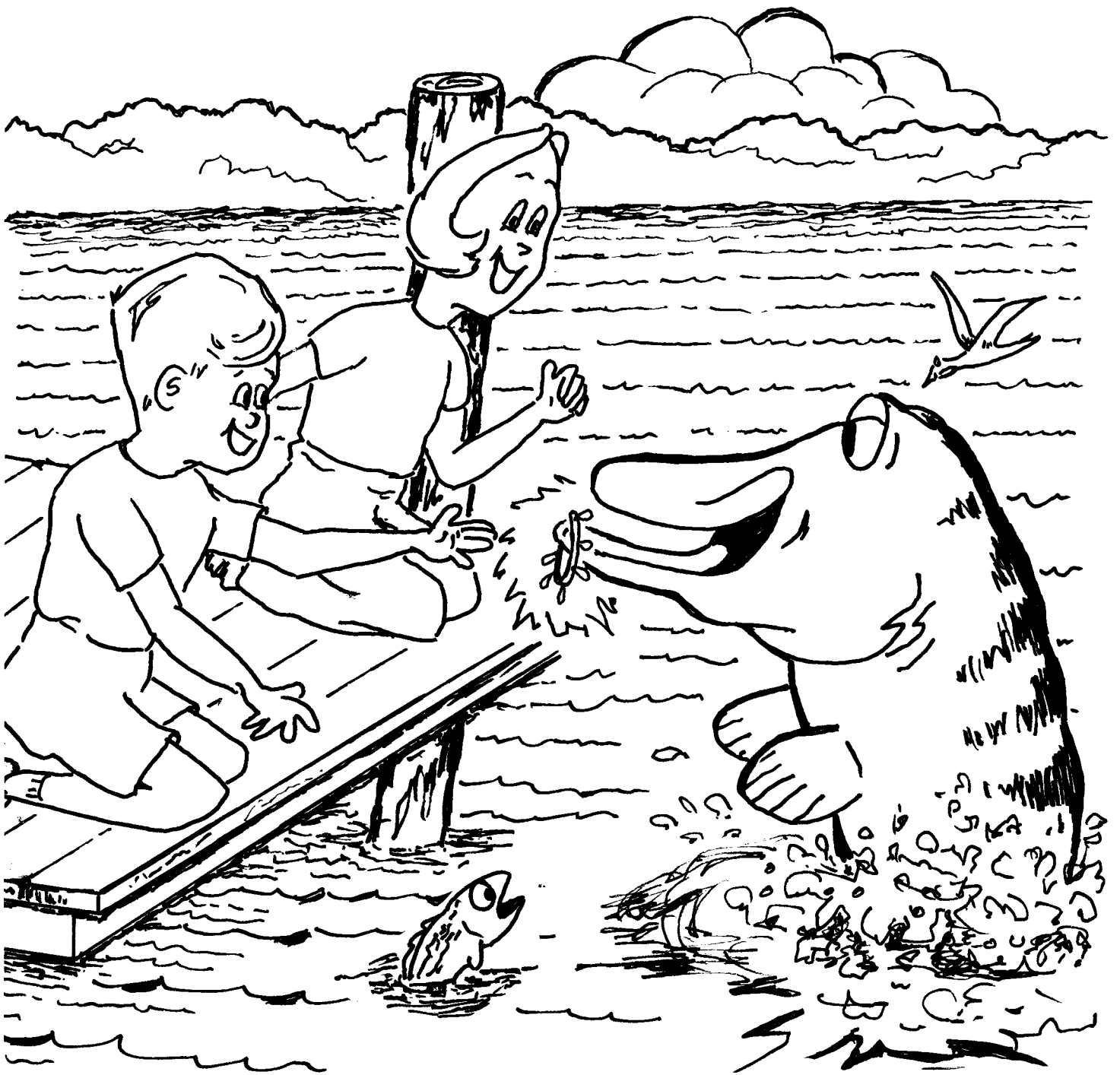
"I will start here and work out into the lake." says Milt.



"Do you think he will find Mother's bracelet? It is so small and the lake is so big," Jenna says.

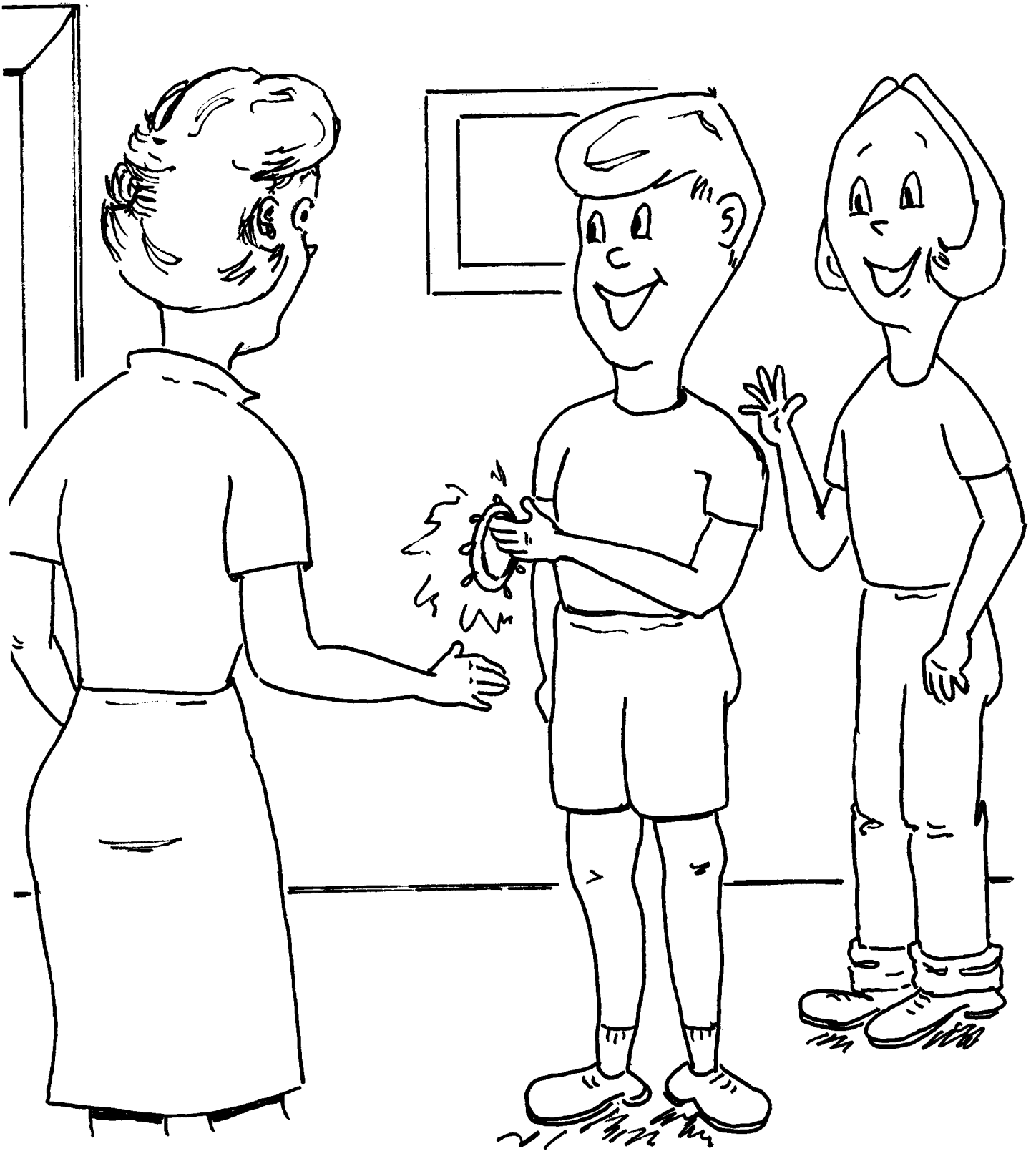
"All we can do is sit here for now," says Justin.

"Oh, thank you, Milt! Mother will love you as we do," say the children.

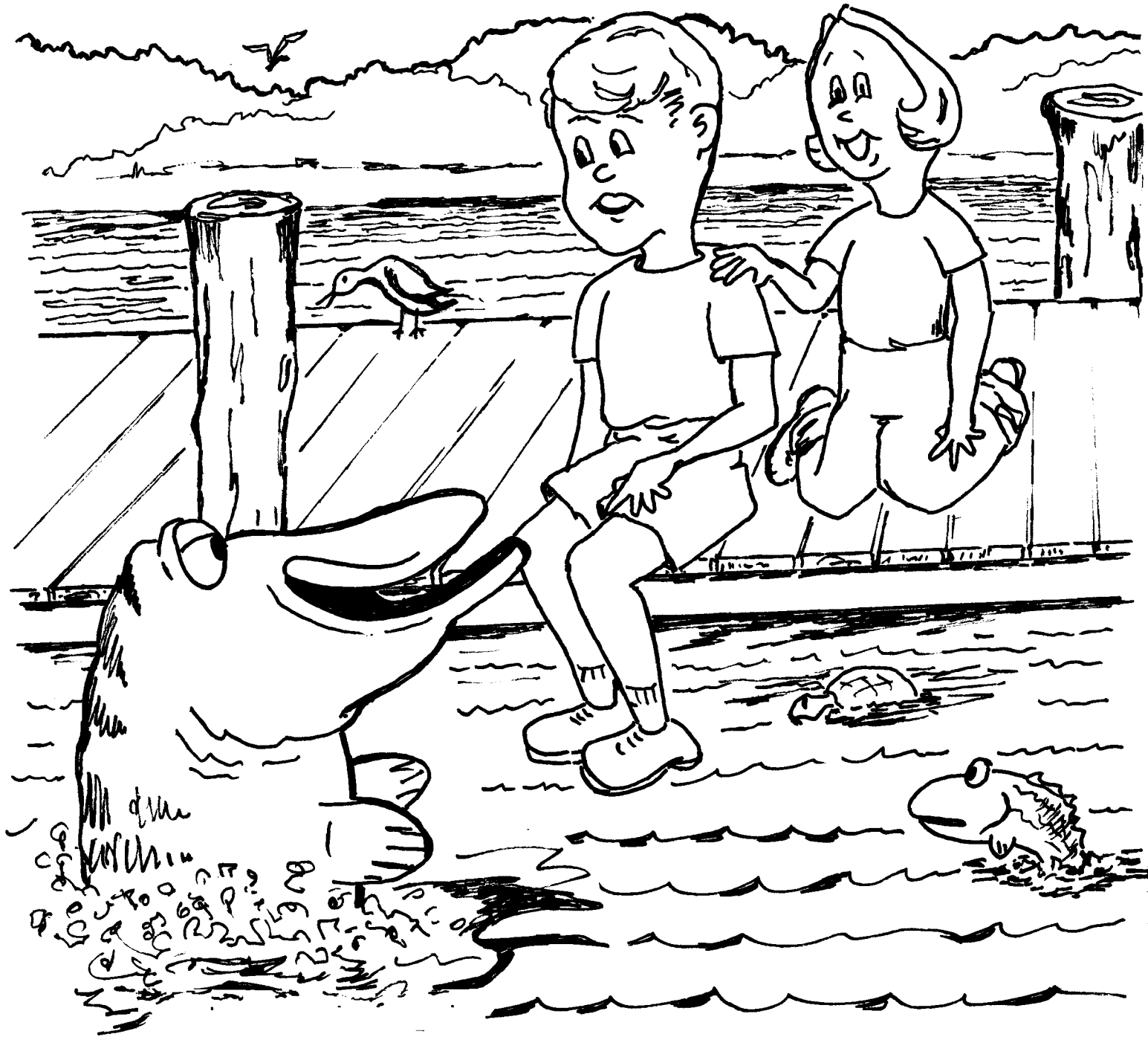


"Mother, Mother! Milt found your bracelet. Here it is," says Justin.

"I think it would be better if we let the children hold on to their made-up friend if it makes them feel good," says Father.



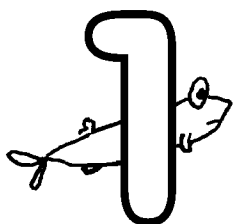
"Mother was so happy to get her bracelet back, she does not want us to ever forget you," says Jenna.

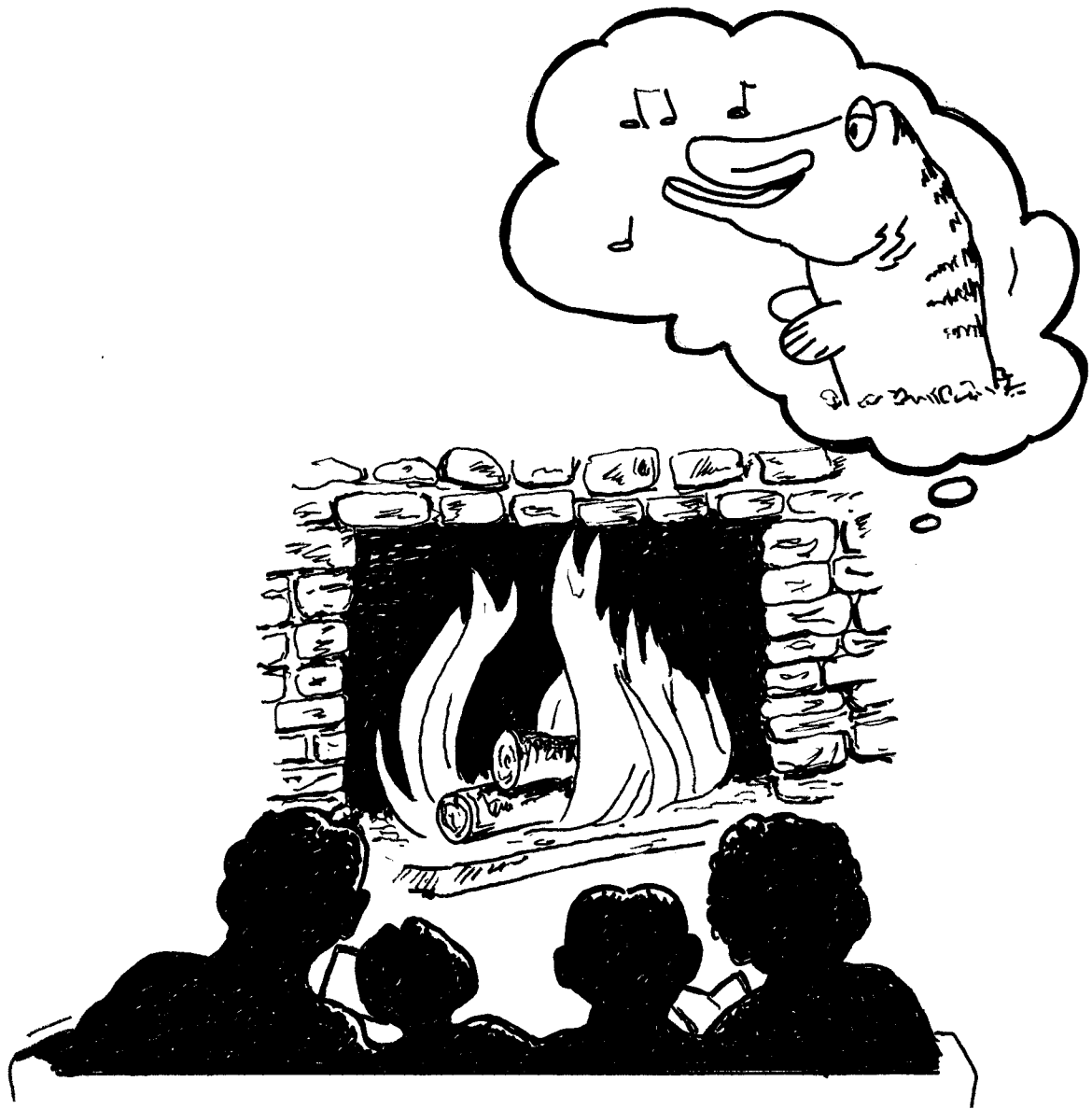
